# Great practice

## *Warp it-Tayside*

- Savings of £162K on 10K investment
- Claimed £16K assets off other Trusts
- Donated £11K assets, Trusts + public sector
- £2.8K of asset donation to local charity
- In Dundee portal allows transfers with University, 2 Councils and Community Voluntary Service
- **200 trusts- up to £9m saved, potential to expand to community equipment?**

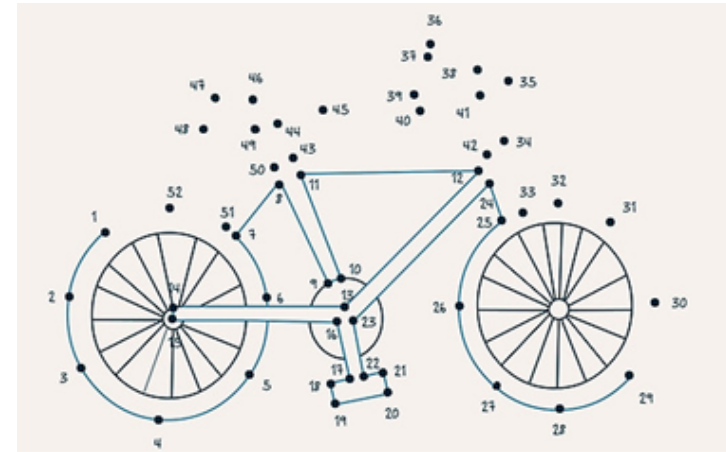
